Andrew DeYoung's black comedy *Friendship* stars Tim Robinson as Craig, a socially awkward suburban dad desperate for a new male friendship. Paul Rudd co-stars as Austin, the charismatic new neighbor whose charm strains Craig's marriage to and their family life, including their teenage son. *Friendship* captures the chaos of growing pains in adult relationships without slipping into sentimentality.

(Pedro Pascal), a wealthy financier.
Against a backdrop of glamor and
high society, Lucy must choose
between genuine emotional
connection and calculated perfection.

This romantic comedy follows Agathe, a clumsy yet endearing bookseller at Paris's famous Shakespeare & Co., who dreams of living a life worthy of her beloved Jane Austen novels.

Struggling to finish her writing and find romance, Agathe travels to England for a Jane Austen writers' residency, where her fairytale expectations collide with reality. There, she becomes involved in an unexpected love triangle and learns that true love isn't any more scriptable than Austen's protagonists.
