## A Nice Indian Boy | June 4 and 6


Directed by Roshan Sethi, 2025, United States Not Rated, 96 min.



Based on Madhuri Shekar's play, this romantic comedy follows Naveen (Karan Soni), an Indian-American doctor, who introduces his fiancé Jay (Jonathan Groff), a white man adopted by Indian parents, to his traditional family. The film humorously and poignantly explores cultural expectations and queer identity. Supporting cast includes Sunita Mani, Zarna Garg, and Harish Patel. Premiering at SXSW 2024, it garnered acclaim across festivals, winning the Sherzum Award at the Hamptons International Film Festival.

## Grand Tour | June 11 and 13

Directed by Miguel Gomes, 2025, Portugal Not Rated, 129 min., subtitled



This historical drama stars
Gonçalo Waddington and Crista
Alfaiate. Set in 1917 colonial
Burma, it follows British civil
servant Edward, who flees his
fiancée, Molly, on their wedding
day, prompting a chase across
Asia. The film blends
melodrama and screwball
comedy. It premiered at the
Cannes Film Festival, where
Gomes won Best Director, and
later secured Best Film, Best
Director, and Best Editing at
Portugal's Sophia Awards.

## The Wedding Banquet | June 18 and 20

Directed by Andrew Ahn, 2025, United States Rated R, 103 minutes



A contemporary reimagining of Ang Lee's 1993 classic, directed by Andrew Ahn, this romantic comedy features Bowen Yang, Lily Gladstone, Kelly Marie Tran, Han Gi-chan, Joan Chen, and Youn Yuh-jung. Set in Seattle, it follows two queer couples navigating love, immigration, and family expectations. The film premiered at the 2025 Sundance Film Festival and was released in theaters on April 18, 2025.

## Holy Cow | June 25 and 27

Directed by Louise Courvoisier, 2025, France Not Rated, 92 min., subtitled



This French coming-of-age drama stars Clément Faveau as Totone, a troubled teen in rural Jura who enters a prestigious cheesemaking competition to save his family's farm. The film's raw portrayal of rural life and nonprofessional cast earned it critical acclaim. It won the Youth Award at Cannes, Best First Film at the César Awards, and the Prix Jean Vigo.
